Bob called the meeting to order at 6:00pm. Bob asked for everyone to review the last meeting's minutes. Martha made a motion to approve the minutes. Bob seconded the motion. Minutes approved.

Old Business

The application for the CCOG Grant was completed and turned in by the May deadline. Although no decision has been made yet regarding the awardees, the committee continued discussion how the \$500 may best serve the community. Beautification projects centered in the Rankin Park area were favored by the committee. We should be hearing something soon regarding which communities will receive a grant.

Discussions continued for the plaque that would commemorate the historic area in town known as the Flats. Donations for this project can be made at City Hall. The size of the plaque and the wording that would be included on it are being considered, as well as price quotes for the project. Thomas will continue working on the organization for this project.

The sprucing up of City Hall, which may include pressure washing and resurfacing/painting of the front tiles, is currently on hold. Quotes to complete such work need to be collected, and there are other city projects that taking precedence. More to come on this work at a later date.

The CIAC is still considering a name change. Thus far, we are undecided. Discussions will continue.

New Business

The CIAC has openings for residents and/or business owners to join this committee.
